## AWARENESS TIPS

The following indicators may point to possible terrorist activities. Alone, each indicator can result from legitimate commercial activity or criminal activity <u>not</u> related to terrorism; however, multiple indicators combined with other factors can possibly suggest a terrorist threat.

- Guests who deny access to housekeeping staff over a period of several consecutive days or who unusually monitor their actions.
- Evidence that guests have changed their physical appearance.
- Clogged drains due to large amounts of cut hair.
- Questionable authenticity of personal identification.
- Payment with large sum of cash to cover an expensive lodging bill.
- Unusual number of visitors admitted by a guest.
- Thefts of guest's luggage containing forms of identification.
- Unusual or excessive luggage, containers, tools, wires, etc.
- Discarded luggage or unusual items left behind by a guest.
- Unusual odors or substances, in the room, unknown to you.
- Delivery of a suspicious parcel (e.g., unusual smell, weight, protruding wires, grease marks, delivered by unknown source).
- Electronic surveillance equipment in room.
- Use of lobby or pay phone instead of room phone.
