



Emergency Closure: CR-626 (Halsey Rd) Distributed: August 8, 2014

**ADVANCED TRAFFIC ADVISORY FOR CR-626 EMERGENCY ROAD CLOSURE
Monday, August 11, 2014, 7:30 A.M. – 3:30 P.M.**

Project:

On Thursday August 7, 2014 the Sussex County Department of Public Works (DPW) noticed a growing localized pavement depression developing in CR-626.

DPW promptly mobilized a work crew to this location who then removed the asphalt pavement layers and sub-base (underlying ground) in an effort to determine the cause of this roadway settlement.

With the removal of pavement a subsurface void was discovered which appears to be associated with a possible defect in an adjacent underground storm drain.

The void below the pavement was filled with good bearing material and the asphalt pavement reconstructed and CR-626 was safely re-opened to full traffic before the end of the day on Thursday.

In an effort to locate, identify and correct the underlying root cause of the roadway settlement (to avoid a future reoccurrence), the County has scheduled an emergency road closure to perform additional work, as needed.

What & Where:

CR-626 will be closed for emergency repair work between CR-519 and Church Road approximately 150 feet west of the Kline Road and the Twin Bridges. (See attached location map which shows a Detour to be posted using portions of CR-519 and CR-627)

When:

The above emergency repairs are expected to take one day with the closure between the hours of 7:30 A.M. and 3:30 P.M on Monday, August 11, 2014.
