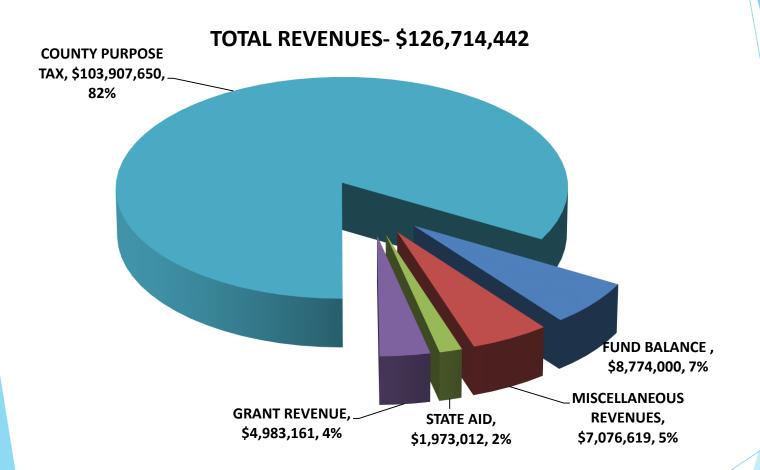

- •"1977" Cap
- Prohibits counties from increasing property tax levy greater than 2.5%...unless action is taken by the governing body
- "2010" Cap
- Establishes a formula limiting increases in the amount to be raised by taxation to 2% of the previous year
- •"2017" County Entity Cap
- Limits the annual increase to the portion of certain county entity budgets funded by the county property tax

GOALS OF THE 2025 BUDGET

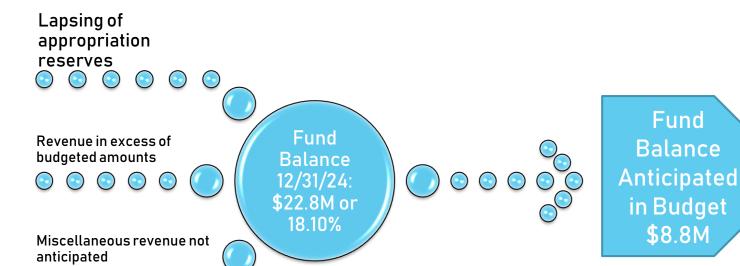
- Being fiscally responsible while keeping Sussex County affordable

The 2025 Budget represents a 3.19% increase from the adopted 2024 budget and an increase to the Tax levy of 0.997%.

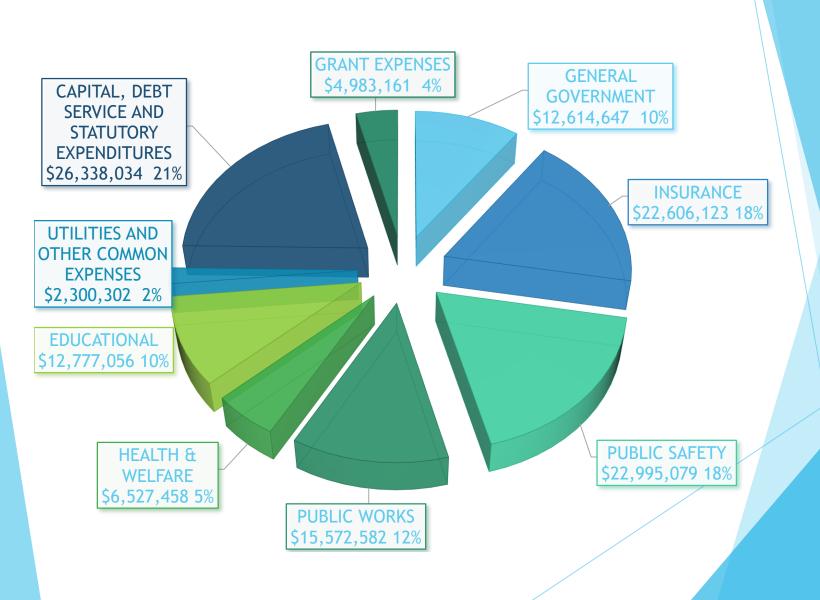

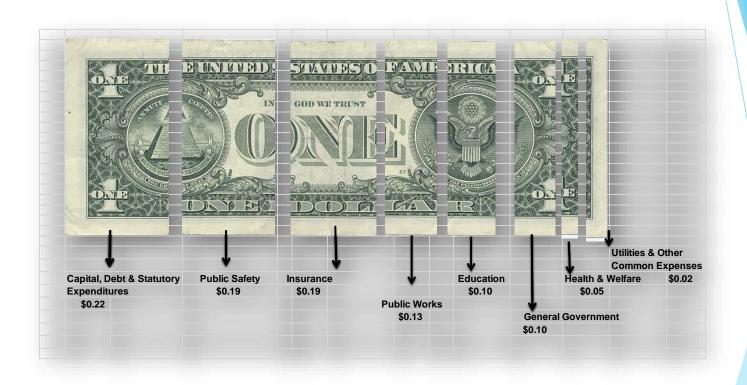

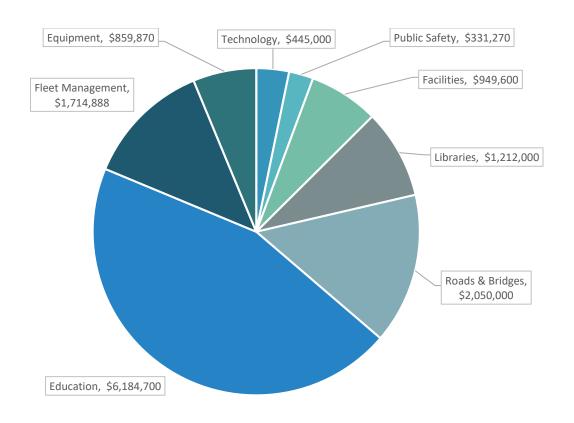


- Advancing County priorities
- Continues to provides resources for County services during higher than average inflationary times while keeping the amount to be raised in taxes lower than the current inflation rate.
- Identifies sustainable revenue sources to limit the increase to the tax levy.
- Continues to support the Technical School, Community College and Volunteer Fire Departments.

- Advancing County priorities
- Utilizes fund balance to ensure long term sustainability and be in compliance with the fund balance policy.
- Maintains the level of funding for debt service and capital improvements consistent with the debt policy.
- ► The budget is a balancing act. Strong credit rating assists with our borrowing costs. Strong fund balance is a key measurement for the rating agencies. County's Standard and Poor's rating= AA+
