# Traditions of the Turtle Clan of the Ramapough Lenape Nation with Chief Vincent Mann

Guest Lecturer and Russ Berrie Award winner Chief Vincent Mann is the chief of the Turtle Clan of the Ramapough Lenape Indian Nation. He is a descendant of the Mann family whose name appears on Native American deeds to colonists. A soft spoken, gentle man, his writings and teachings give comfort to the Ramapough who face discrimination and poverty. Recently, he led a spiritual paddle up waterways in New York State celebrating the importance of water.

In 2017, Chief Mann won the Russ Berrie Award for his efforts in protecting the lands and water of his clan people living on the Ringwood Mines Superfund Site. In 2015, he was the architect, along with SCCC professor Judith Joan Sullivan, Esq., of the first in the nation prototype of Native Americans acting as cultural monitors during natural gas pipeline construction in New Jersey. Professor Sullivan teaches in SCCC's Legal Studies and Criminal Justice Programs. Chief Mann volunteers thousands of hours each year to help the community, including non-Natives.

Chief Mann will be speaking about the historic Nichols Treaty, the history of the Turtle Clan from the 1700's to present day, the medicinal use of a few native plants and the cultural significance of how elders are treated by the tribe. Chief Mann will also be sharing a prayer song and tobacco ceremony with attendees.

# The Harsh Realities of War: Major General William Tecumseh Sherman and the Campaign of the Carolinas in 1865

As the Civil War was drawing to a close, the Union armies were converging towards the Confederate capitol of Richmond. Major General William T. Sherman's armies, having just completed their successful March to the Sea, began their journey north, moving through the first state to secede, South Carolina. Although their routes were unknown, the people of South Carolina were filled with anticipatory fear awaiting their fate. This course will look at the actions of Sherman's armies as well as their encounters with the civilians and opposing forces. It will also explore the burning of Columbia, S.C. Once Sherman's men left South Carolina, the strife was not over as Major General Edward Potter commenced his raids there. Sherman's troops finished their campaigning in North Carolina as the war drew to a close.

Dr. Heidi Amelia-Anne Weber holds the rank of full professor of military history/history at the State University of New York at Orange. Heidi earned her Ph.D. from Kent State University in 19<sup>th</sup> Century American History. Her specialty is the Antebellum South as well as the application of total warfare in Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina in 1864-1865. In addition, she was also selected as a Fellow in the United States Military Academy Summer Seminar in Military History. Heidi has published chapters and made contributions in the <u>World of Antebellum America: A Daily Life Encyclopedia</u>, <u>The Handbook of Military Administration</u>, <u>The Encyclopedia of the Reconstruction Era</u> as well has written many articles and book reviews. In 2017, Dr. Weber was awarded the SUNY: Orange President's Award for Excellence in Teaching and the New York Chancellor's Award for Teaching Excellence.

# **Introduction to Drawing**

This three-part course emphasizes the development of observational drawing skills and hand-eye coordination. Basic drawing elements such as line, proportion, perspective, composition, texture, and the study of light and shade are investigated through various perceptual and conceptual approaches. Open to beginning students as well as those who want to refresh their skills before moving on to more advanced studio courses. Professor Michael Hughes is a practicing artist and member of the Fine Arts Faculty at SCCC. He holds degrees in Studio Arts, Art History and Graphic Design. He has participated in group shows and won awards for his work. Student members of the Fine Arts Club have volunteered to assist Prof. Hughes.

Students are required to bring their own drawing supplies. Basic tools should include a large newsprint pad and a very basic drawing kit containing charcoal pencils, graphite drawing pencils, charcoal sticks and eraser.

**Directions to the Art Gallery**: Students should park in the lower main parking lot (like they usually do for the Center events held in the Performing Arts Center's Atrium) walk to "B" building (the building with the flagpole located directly in front of it) and go through the front glass doors and ask for directions to the Art Gallery at the Information Desk in the Lobby.

# **SCCC Senior Citizen Tuition Waiver Policy**

Sussex County residents 65 years and older are entitled to **free tuition for eligible college level credit courses** offered by SCCC. Some courses may incur a lab fee.

This tuition policy does not apply to Center for Lifelong Learning non-credit programming.

Free tuition for senior citizens is offered with the following conditions: a) the class must be eligible for the senior citizen free tuition (some limited enrollment courses such as labs or field experience courses will not be eligible); b) paid enrollment warrants the course being conducted; c) sufficient space is available in the class; and d) registration for the course must occur only during the final two business days before the start of the semester. Applicants who opt to register earlier are not eligible for free tuition. Applicants may take the course for college credit or may choose to audit the course.

Applicants must register in person during the specified registration time period (the final two days before the start of the semester), and must present proof of eligibility at the time of registration. Applicants may seek advising assistance from the Student Advisement Center, but must register at the Office of the Registrar.

# **Meet the Director**

Nancy R. Gallo, J.D., is the Director of the Center for Lifelong Learning. She founded the Center in 2015 with the Senior Services Division of Sussex County to bring topics to the Center that promote invigorating lifelong learning for Sussex County seniors at the College's convenient Newton location. Professor Gallo is also the College's Legal Studies Program Coordinator and in that role teaches courses leading to the Elder Law Specialist Certificate, as well as the Paralegal Certificate, Degree and Pre-Law Option Degree.

Professor Gallo has practiced law in both Florida and New Jersey and was trained by the New Jersey Institute for Continuing Legal Education as a certified mediator. Prior to law school, she was a newspaper features editor and award-winning reporter. While an SCCC faculty member, Dr. Gallo received a National Endowment for the Humanities funded grant for the study, "Paul Robeson, 20th Century Humanist and Lawyer."

Professor Gallo is the author of the textbooks, "Introduction to Family Law" published as part of the West Legal Studies Series, and "Elder Law" published by Delmar/Thompson Publishing.

Additionally, Dr. Gallo was the writer and producer of "Legal Briefs," a radio show. She has a primary research interest in elder law and the issues of aging in the 21st century life. Dr. Gallo lives in a restored 160 year old farmhouse on a family farm with her husband, children and two completely bonded Dachshunds.
