Fishing and Hunting Programs

- Hook-A-Winner Program Every year NJDFW jaw tags more than 1,000 brook trout for pre-release in New Jersey water's. Lucky anglers who land these fish are to send their name, address, fish tag number and location of catch to the Pequest Trout Hatchery, 605 Pequest Rd., Oxford, NJ 07863, Attn: Hook a Winner Program.¹ In return they will receive a certificate and award patch and have their names entered into a Trout Unlimited drawing for a rod & reel.
- New Jersey Record Fish For those who caught the "big one." Fish must be hooked and landed by entrant. Records are determined solely by weight. Fish must be weighed on a certified scale. A clear photograph of the fish next to a yardstick must be furnished to clearly show length. In cases of uncertain identification fish should be refrigerated to permit inspection by a biologist. Photos of winners with their record fishes are published on the Record Fish website.²
- <u>Skillful Angler Awards Program</u> This program has been administered by NJDFW for over 20 years. It recognizes anglers who catch fish of "not quite record size, but are impressive and worthy of recognition". Qualifying "skillful anglers" receive a signed certificate and a bronze pin.
- Outstanding White-tailed Deer Program This program is jointly sponsored by NJDFW and several private sportsmen's organizations. It is designed to "recognize the quality of the state's deer resource and the sports men and women who hunt for them.⁴ It includes categories for the largest deer taken and finest antler development. Awards are given each season for the season's best. Winners for each season are posted on the programs web page.
- Outstanding Gobbler Award Program This program was developed to recognize what the NJDFW likes to refer to as "one of the greatest success stories in wildlife management". Each year winners are selected in both typical and non-typical categories. Birds must be weighed on a certified scale, before or after gutting. Submitters must obtain a receipt with the date, store location and name of person who weighed the bird recorded.
- Hunters Helping the Hungry Taking advantage of the liberal season length and bag limits, it is currently possible to harvest as many as 14 deer (possibly more in some zones) during the seasons. This program allows hunters who wish to spend the time and money to take full advantage of the deer season, to provide valuable meat for needy families. In Sussex County there is one participating butcher:
