AWARENESS TIPS

The following indicators may point to possible terrorist activities. Alone, each indicator can result from legitimate activity or criminal activity not related to a terrorist; however, multiple indicators can suggest a terrorist threat.

- Theft of fuel from your business inventory or tractor-trailer(s).
- Theft of equipment and/or vehicle used to transport fuel.
- Customer requests to purchase unusual amounts of fuel
- Unusual inquiries from strangers concerning how you store or handle fuel.
- Observations of your business facility/business by unknown persons (e.g., monitoring the arrival or departure of fuel trucks).
- Reports by employees of unknown persons observed trespassing on your property or taking photographs of your facility & equipment.
- Reports by employees of people being questioned by suspicious individuals as to their routine or activities.

FACILITY PRECAUTIONS

- Safeguard uniforms, patches, badges, ID cards and other forms of official identification to protect against unauthorized access to facilities, including stripping all decommissioned vehicles slated for resale and/or salvage of all agency identifying markings and emergency warning devices.
- Check multiple forms of valid identification for each facility visitor.
- Verify the legitimate business needs of all approaching vehicles & personnel.
- Improve identification card technology to eliminate unauthorized duplication.
- Alert uniform store vendors of the need to establish and verify the identities of individuals seeking to purchase uniform articles.
- Ensure all personnel are provided a security briefing regarding present and emerging threats.
