B. Presentations

Tick-Borne Illness- Doreen Edwards with John Scimer and Marty Theys

Doreen Edwards started the Presentation explaining their Mission, "Prevention through Education". Next, Mr. Scimer showed a video on Mosquitos and Tick Control. The video highlighted the appearance of ticks, how they can be carried by other animals, the history of Lyme disease and how debilitating is the disease. Also how underfunded the government spends per case and the best prevention is to dress accordingly, check yourself, your children and your pets for ticks and if one is found carefully remove it fully intact and send it out to be tested. Next Marty Theys spoke of his one personal experience with Lyme disease and how it can be difficult for medical personnel to diagnose the disease. There are few Lyme disease specialists

Packets containing various materials including a tick specimen bag and how and where to send the specimen to be tested were provided to each Freeholder. Most local testing is administered at East Stroudsburg University, Pa. Discussion concluded that they would appreciate any assistance from the Freeholders to help them share this information to the General Public as well as Civic Groups. Mr. Theys suggested perhaps a program with SCCC inconjunction with East Stroudsburg University could be arranged for tick testing.

Freeholder Yardley agreed on the importance of this topic. He appreciates all the work that they have done and he gave Marty Theys extra kudos for his hard work.

MOTION made at 7:50 PM by Freeholder Graham to open the meeting for Public Session; seconded by Freeholder Petillo and passed unanimously.

Mary Dolan from Frankford Township representing Ginny's House Child Advocacy Center and represents them on the Human Services Advisory Council gave a brief overview on what HSAC has been working on. She said HSAC will be participating in the First Bi-Annual Sussex County Education Partnership Training event to be held on October 24th.

She said the Homeless Coalition Committee continues to work on a strategy that will strengthen its mission of planning and coordinating the delivery of emergency services to the County's homeless population. The Committee has also begun the 2019 Point in Time Survey.

Annually one day a year, they try to locate all the homeless families in Sussex County to get a statistic which is submitted to the State. The Human Services Advisory Council approved the Child Abuse and Missing Children's Committee recommendation to provide \$2,500 in grant funding to domestic abuse and sexual assault intervention services which would be DASI to host a conference that focuses on the relationship between child abuse, animal abuse and domestic violence. New studies have indicated that those disciplines need to be working together. This conference will be a kick-off to a task force on how to address those three issues in Sussex County. Last year the committee looked at populations that are risk for child abuse and they decided that homeless children so the money was divided between the Samaritan Inn and Family Promises. She thanked the Freeholder Board for their continued support with their organization.

Freeholder Petillo asked a question on educating the school personnel. Who in the school would come to this?

Ms. Dolan said that invitations are sent to the entire school so that we are hoping that social workers, child study teams, as well as the vice principals.

Freeholder Petillo asked if they get a good response from them.

Ms. Dolan answered yes.

Freeholder Petillo thanked her for all the work they do.

9. FREEHOLDERS' COMMENTS

Freeholder Yardley – He hopes everyone views the video from last week's meeting with the College and the Technical High School. It was a very interesting meeting. Next, he reported that he attended the Healthy Living Festival Fair for seniors. This event was well attended, very informative but felt it could be better advertised in the future.

Freeholder Lazzaro – He said the County road line striping program has been completed for the 35 locations throughout the County. The bridge in Sussex is on schedule. New Jersey Associations of Counties had their meeting a few weeks ago and one of the topics of discussion was the 911 funding. If the Federal Government has its way; New Jersey will be ineligible for \$115,000,000 in 911 funding to upgrade public safety answering points known as the PSAPs with 911 capabilities. The reason for the ineligibility is because New Jersey has been taking this money and spending it on other Public Safety expenses and not the intended program. Every phone weather landline or cell pays nine cents a month toward the 911 Fund. New Jersey has collected \$1.3 billion in fees since 2006 with only 11% of the funds being spent on eligible expenses. The rest of the money was diverted to cover general operation expenses in the Department of Law and Public Safety. It seems no one wants to take this on. This money needs to be going into the 911 Centers.

Freeholder Graham – He tagged onto what Mr. Lazzaro said. Sussex County has only received approximately \$65,000 in those 10 years. As Tax Payers you are paying toward local PSAPS, County wide PSAPS not only from your phone bills but also in your local and County Taxes. You are paying three times for this service. This is not right and applauded Carl for his efforts.

He also agreed with Mr. Yardley and encouraged all to watch the video from last week's meeting at the Technical High School. This was a four hour meeting. It is very vital and important to know that this Board supports the curriculum that is being put forward but there have been some questions with the financing and there are some questions about how the financing is going to come about.

Next, Freeholder Graham spoke about the Health and Human Services Department. It is flu season and you can check out the County's website for the clinic dates throughout the County. There are clinics for those 65 and older and younger. NJCEED women's screening with our Public Nursing is available as well. He spoke about Medicare Part D open enrollment. This is a very important feature the County's has and it is run primarily by volunteers. There is support through the Sussex County State Health Insurance Assistance Program. Between October 15th and December 7th you need to enroll in your Part D. There are people in this building that can help you as well as other locations throughout the County.

There were 49 reportable diseases diagnosed within Sussex County just within the 1st and the 20th of this Month. 34 of 49 were Lyme. He reported that there seems to be a rise in tick-borne diseases since the spring.

The County's Health and Human Services Department does a fantastic job and people should take advantage of the services we provide.

Freeholder Petillo- Thanked Ms. Edwards and the others for their earlier presentation on tick-borne diseases. Her husband was bit by a tick and it took six months to diagnose he had Lyme disease. As a result of his exposure he now wears a pace maker.

The Department of Health and Human Services will be hosting another Health Forum on Thursday, October 11th from 8AM to 11AM. It is for municipalities. If the Mayors and Council people unable to attend please send the BA or someone else. We want to get the resources out to the people who are with the people. She didn't realize the depth of this organization until working here. We are achieving to get the information out to the municipalities.
